GOVERNOR SUNUNU VETOES BILLS THAT WOULD HELP HARD WORKING GRANITE STATERS

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Today Governor Sununu vetoed a number of bills that would have helped hard working Granite State families, including [HB 211](#), [HB 293](#) and [SB 18](#). **Representative Brian Sullivan (D-Grantham), Chair of the House Labor Committee**, released the following statement:

“Today Governor Sununu vetoed three bills that would have helped hardworking Granite State families. Combined with his previous vetoes and insistence for another tax break for corporate special interests, this should make clear to all Granite Staters that their priorities take a back seat to the governor’s big business pals.”

“Requiring applicants to disclose credit or salary history as a condition of employment is not just an issue of privacy but of fairness for all New Hampshire citizens. No one in the ‘Live Free or Die’ state should be forced to give businesses personal information that might result in employment discrimination and is irrelevant to the position they are applying for.”

“House Democrats will continue to put the best interests of Granite Staters first because clearly the Governor does not.”
