SUNUNU VETO KEEPS NEW HAMPSHIRE IN SUSPENDED "CROSSCHECK" PROGRAM

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Today, the House of Representatives failed to override Governor Sununu's veto of [HB 315](#), which would end New Hampshire's involvement with the Kansas-based Interstate Voter Registration Crosscheck Program and authorize the Secretary of State to join another program to share voter information. **Deputy House Majority Leader Marjorie Porter (D-Hillsborough)** released the following statement:

"The Crosscheck program was suspended because it produced an extremely high number of false positives and was subjected to numerous lawsuits. There is absolutely no reason New Hampshire should continue transferring any personal voter data to this irreputable organization. Initially, this bill passed the House unanimously with Republicans joining Democrats in understanding the need to end our state's association with Crosscheck."

"The Governor clearly did not understand the bill, as his veto message showed. It is disappointing to see House Republicans flip their votes yet again to provide cover for Governor Sununu's misguided vetoes."
