### **HOUSE VOTES TO RESTORE COMMON SENSE ELECTION LAWS**

**CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE** – The House of Representatives voted today to pass [HB 105](#) and [HB 106](#), which repeal changes made last session to require additional paperwork and require payment of fees by some voters. **Representative Doug Ley (D-Jaffrey)** released the following statement:

“The bills passed today restore common sense to our election process and protect the constitutional rights of all voters. Voting restrictions passed last term were clearly intended to make it less desirable and more difficult for college students to vote in New Hampshire. Students live here, abide by our laws, pay taxes and are active members of our communities. Requiring students who vote to re-register their car in New Hampshire has no legitimate purpose other than to discourage the act of voting.”

“Discouraging young people from getting involved in our elections only exacerbates the difficulty we have keeping the young families who will grow our economy in New Hampshire. The House’s votes today restore integrity to our election process and make clear that all eligible voters are treated equally.”
