HOUSE VOTES TO SEND MINIMUM WAGE TO GOVERNOR'S DESK

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE – The House of Representatives voted [207-143](#) today to adopt the committee of conference report for [SB 10](#), relative to the state minimum hourly rate. The bill will go to the Governor's desk after final passage by the Senate. **Representative Brian Sullivan (D- Grantham), Chair of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee** released the following statement:

"New Hampshire is the only state in New England that still allows the federal government to set our minimum wage. Senate Bill 10 proposes a gradual increase of the state's minimum wage to \$10 per hour for 2020 and 2021 and \$12 per hour for 2022 and beyond."

"This legislation was a priority of both the House and Senate, and I'm proud of the bill we've produced. It is a reasonable, measured approach to increasing our minimum wage here in New Hampshire over the next 3 years. Senate Bill 10 is a step in the right direction towards hardworking Granite Staters being able to make ends meet and participate in our economy, and I urge Governor Sununu to sign it into law."
