HOUSE-PASSED LEGISLATION PROTECTS NEW HAMPSHIRE BUSINESSES AFFECTED BY WAYFAIR DECISION

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE – The House of Representatives voted [308-25](#) today to pass [SB 242](#), legislation addressing the 2018 U.S. Supreme Court decision *South Dakota v. Wayfair, Inc., et al.* **Representative Susan Almy (D-Lebanon), Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee**, released the following statement:

“This bill is the result of bipartisan collaboration which began immediately after the *Wayfair* decision was issued last June. As one of only five states in the U.S. without a sales tax, New Hampshire businesses are in a unique position of not having to establish administrative systems to comply with traditional sales and use tax laws.”

“Within the framework of the *Wayfair* decision, this legislation protects New Hampshire businesses against unconstitutional attempts to collect and remit sales taxes, and against fraudulent actors posing as legitimate taxing jurisdictions. It is imperative that the legislature take every step possible to protect New Hampshire business from fraudulent and unconstitutional requests, and this legislation does just that. Today’s strong vote in the House shows that attempts to harm New Hampshire businesses will be met with bipartisan opposition.”
