

RELEASE: Governor Blocks Legislation to Expand Extended Learning for New Hampshire Students

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GOVERNOR BLOCKS LEGISLATION TO EXPAND EXTENDED LEARNING FOR NEW HAMPSHIRE STUDENTS

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Today, Governor Sununu vetoed [HB 1454](#), which would establish a process for the application, vetting, and approval of alternative learning credits. **Representative Mel Myler (D-Hopkinton), Chair of the House Education Committee**, released the following statement:

“This bill would have expanded options for extended learning opportunities (ELO) for New Hampshire students. By engaging the NH Department of Education directly with ELO networks, this bill sought to assist local school boards with state vetting of ELO programs and expand the program to local school districts. By vetoing this bill, which would have brought greater opportunities for extended learning, the governor has turned his back on the students, families and local businesses who desperately look to build the future workforce through apprentice programs and work-based learning.”

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
