HOUSE-PASSED LEGISLATION WILL IMPROVE EDUCATION AND PROTECT STUDENTS

Today, the New Hampshire House voted 201-129 to pass HB 1558, comprehensive education legislation. **Representative Mel Myler (D-Hopkinton), Chair of the House Education Committee**, released the following statement:

“The comprehensive education bill passed today is very important to our schools and the children they serve. Assuring that students have access to special education and behavioral health resources and that schools have the resources to offer needed programs will be especially important as education moves back into the classroom. While House Republicans chose to oppose this bipartisan legislation, I thank Democrats and Republicans in the Senate, and Democrats in the House, for assuring that this critical legislation reaches the Governor’s desk.”
