

HOUSE PASSES NUMEROUS BILLS ADDRESSING COVID-19 CARE FOR GRANITE STATERS AND PROVIDERS

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Today, the New Hampshire House passed several pieces of legislation HB 578, HB 1246, HB 1520, HB 1623, and HB 1639, critical to addressing healthcare needs in the wake of the first wave of COVID-19 pandemic. Vice Chair of the House Health and Human Services and Elderly Affairs committee, **Representative Polly Campion (D-Etna)** released the following statement:
