### **TRANSPORTATION PLAN SIGNED INTO LAW DESPITE ATTEMPTED REPUBLICAN OBSTRUCTION**

**CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE** – Omnibus transportation bill [HB 1128](#), which includes updates to New Hampshire’s 10-year Transportation Improvement Plan, was signed into law today.

**Representative John Cloutier (D-Claremont), Chair of the House Public Works and Highways Committee**, released the following statement:

“This bill contains a number of transportation initiatives that are important to the people of New Hampshire, highlighted by the Transportation Improvement Plan which is critical to the long-term planning of New Hampshire’s roadways and transportation infrastructure.

Upkeep of roads and bridges is one of the core functions that people expect out of state government. It is important to note that most House Republicans tried to block this plan from even reaching the governor’s desk, which would have increased costs and delayed important projects like removal of the Merrimack tollbooth. I thank my Democratic colleagues for passing this bill to assure that highway upkeep will remain cost-effective and timely.”
