GOVERNOR REJECTS HIS OWN PROCESS CONCERNS BY SIGNING OMNIBUS ADMINISTRATION BILL

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE –Today, Governor Sununu today signed [HB 1245](#), omnibus legislation containing reforms that state agencies need to conduct efficient operation of state government. This action comes a day after Governor Sununu vetoed [HB 1234](#), another administrative omnibus bill, [citing only process](#) as his reason for rejection. **House Majority Leader Doug Ley (D-Jaffrey)** released the following statement:

“Just yesterday, Governor Sununu vetoed a bipartisan omnibus bill citing no policy objections, only concerns with process. Specifically, the governor cited the length of the bill, the hearing process, and the myriad policy areas covered as his reasons for rejection. While I am glad that the governor signed HB 1245 today, I must note that this bill contained the same number of policy areas, followed the same hearing process, and was actually longer than the bill he rejected yesterday. Perhaps the governor read my comments about that veto and realized the error of his ways.

The people of New Hampshire deserve to know why the governor is taking the actions he takes. Based on his actions today, his public veto message on HB 1234 yesterday was clearly a lie. One is left to wonder why Governor Sununu is trying to hide the real reason for his actions, given his penchant for prioritizing corporate donors over Granite Staters.”
